



Our Response to the Extension of a State of Emergency

We have implemented remote working policy for all of the employees both in and outside Japan with the aim of preventing the spread of the new coronavirus (COVID-19) infection, in response to the Tokyo Governor's request on March 25 and the state of emergency which the Japanese Government declared on April 7 and April 16.

Furthermore, since the state of emergency was extended to May 31(declared on May 4), we have decided to continue the same measures as follows for the time being.

Our power plants are operating and under-construction power plants are ongoing as usual with safety foremost in our mind for stable power supply, while avoiding "Closed spaces" "Crowded places" "Close-contact settings".

- We will implement remote working policy for all of the employees both in and outside Japan.
- We will in principle prohibit all the employees from having unessential business trips, face-toface interviews, participation in meetings or events.
- Regarding our power plants and under-construction power plants, we will make prompt decisions the request of each local authorities

We will closely monitor the situation, the government's decision and administrative policies so that we will be able to respond quickly and appropriately.
